Camporee Information and Guidelines

- 1. Registration:** Your unit is registered when you have paid your fees by using the provided Registration Form in the Leader's Guide. You need to complete a Camporee Unit Roster (also provided), BSA Local Tour Permit (file the Local Tour Permit with Council and bring a copy to camporee), and keep with you a copy of each person's **Health History Form** currently found on the back of the BSA individual applications or the Class I Personal Health and Medical Summary. **Registration fees are \$6.00 each per Scout and Scouter. Registration will be at the Round Table on February 2, March 2, and April 6, 2006. Fees and registration must be turned in at Roundtable. Late Registration will be at sign in on Friday April 28, 2006, at Camporee headquarters.**
- 2. Late registration fee will be \$7.50 for both Scouts and Scouters. Fees and all registration forms must be completed and presented at the time of registration before your unit will be assigned or allowed to enter a campsite.** Pre-registered units will be given their campsite assignments at the gate upon arrival. All units (Cub or Boy Scout) that have not pre-registered must come to the Dining Hall and complete registration before being assigned a campsite. All registration forms must be completed and turned in by 11:00 PM Friday Apr 28, 2006.
- 3. FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
- 4. Campsites:** Campsites will be assigned as pre-registration is received. Troops and packs will be camping in the same site. Troops that do not have a Pack can adopt a Pack and be co-located. The registrar will need to have that information when each unit is registering for Camporee. Venture units will have their own area.
- 5. Check-In will begin at 4:00 PM on Friday, Apr 28, 2006. Absolutely no one will enter earlier!**
 - Upon arrival on Friday, pre-registered units will be directed to their campsites. All drivers must know what unit they belong to!!
 - Please have someone from your unit return to the Dining Hall to complete the registration process. **ONLY ONE!**
 - Unit trailers and one vehicle per troop or pack may be left in camp. **ALL OTHER** vehicles will be out of the campsites and parked in the appropriate parking lots by 11:00 PM.
- 6. Quiet Hours:** Everyone must be in his or her respective campsites between the hours of **11:00 PM and 6:00 AM**. All are expected to be quiet. "*A scout is Courteous*". **This is each unit leader's responsibility.**
- 7. Health and Safety:** All safety precautions will be adhered to throughout the camporee. Report all unsafe conditions and actions to the Camporee Chief immediately. If the action is unsafe, stop the action.

- 8. First Aid:** Scout leaders are to be prepared to handle all minor situations. Each unit is to have a First Aid Kit in their campsite. Serious injuries and emergencies must be reported immediately to the Camporee Headquarters (Dining Hall). There will be a trained Medical Technician present on site during the entire Camporee. Units having additional trained medical personnel present are asked to notify our Health and Safety Chairperson. The nearest full service hospital is Moore Regional Hospital in Pinehurst, NC.
- 9. Campfires:** Fire Pits are prohibited. Use ground fires only (if camporee staff permits). Under no circumstances will any tree be cut down. Use extreme caution with all fires. Keep all fires at a reasonable size; never leave a fire unattended and always provide adult supervision for all fires. Each unit must bring it's own fire extinguishers. **If there is a ban on open fires, all units need to plan for no-heat meals, use camp stoves properly. This also applies to Cub Scouts and Family Campers. NOTE: Use of liquid fire starters is prohibited within the Boy Scouts of America.**
- 10. Chemical Fuels:** Use of liquid fuel, propane, and butane in stoves and lanterns is permitted only with knowledgeable adult supervision.
- 11. Campsite Inspection:** Campsites will be inspected. A member from each campsite will assist a campsite inspection team. Each patrol will be inspected and checked separately. The adult area will not be inspected.
- 12. Gateways:** Marked entrance ways to each campsite with materials provided by Camporee Staff and found at Camp Durant. Units may not bring materials with them. Construction of gateways will be included in Kudu Horn competition.
- 13. Water:** Water is available at the tap near each campsite latrine. Scouts should carry their own canteens during all activities. Each unit should bring a water hose to help with clean-up.
- 14. Uniforms:** Field uniforms are to be worn during Campfire, and the Interfaith Service. Activity uniforms are to be worn at all other times. **Camouflage Clothing is not permitted** at any time for Scouts or Scouters.
- 15. Trading Post:** The Trading Post opens at 9:00 AM.
- 16. Visitors:** Visitors are welcome. They may observe all events, activities, visit unit campsites, and attend the Camporee Campfire. All visitors must leave the Camporee by 11:00 PM each night. All persons who stay overnight must be registered with a unit or Family Camping and pay Camporee fees. (All visitors must check in at Camporee Headquarters - Dining Hall.
- 17. Campfire Program:** Each unit will draw a number at sign in, number will correlate to a song, skit, cheer or nothing. Awards will be given at the campfire.

- 18. Worship Service:** *A Scout is reverent.* An interfaith service will be held on Sunday morning at the Flagpole at 8:30 AM. There will be no movement of vehicles in camp until after the service is completed.
- 19. Check-Out:** Check-out forms and procedures will be given upon arrival.
- 20. Trash/Garbage:** Expect that all non-burnable garbage and trash will be carried out upon departure. Dumpsters should be available. Insure that all trash is in the dumpster. NOT piled on top. .
- 21. Alternate Plans:** No plans have been made for rescheduling or canceling the camporee. In case of extreme weather or major emergency, the Camporee Chief or the Professional Staff may cancel the camporee. If the camporee is to be cancelled, the scout shop will be notified. The local radio stations (Q98 & WKML) will also be notified. The County Sheriff or Professional Advisor will notify the Camporee Chief to start evacuation procedures (if needed). **If there is a ban on open fires, all units need to plan for no-heat meals, use camp stoves properly.**
- 22.** Camporee T-shirts must be pre-ordered through Camporee Registrar. **Deadline for ordering T-Shirts is April Roundtable. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
- 23.** If there are more than 2 units per campsite, the units are expected to share shelters and other facilities and to clean them up together.
- 24. PROHIBITED ITEMS:** Fireworks, Firearms, sheath knives, non-prescription drugs, and alcoholic beverages. Youth are NOT to carry communication or radio devices. Frequencies will be assigned at check in for units requiring radio communication. Anyone bringing prohibited items will be required to leave with forfeiture of all fees paid.
- 25. Absolutely no pets are allowed. This includes visitors.** Dogs used for the visually impaired are permitted.
- 26. RULES VIOLATIONS: The Camporee Chief in consultation with the Camporee Staff will determine penalties for any violation of the rules.**
- 27. Lost and Found:** Lost and Found items are to be turned in to Headquarters (Dining Hall). These items will be displayed at Flag Raising/Flag Lowering and Assembly.
- 28. Needed Patrol Equipment:** Each patrol will carry the following items. Except for Rain Gear and Water Bottle, only one of each is needed for the patrol, so a Day Bag or backpack is not necessary: Patrol Flag, Scout Handbook, Pocketknife, First Aid Kit, small water squirt gun (no Super Soakers), Rain Gear (per member), Water Bottle (per member), Fire Starter Kit (no chemical material or commercial fire starters), Sun Protection, Compass, Notebook, Pen or Pencil, 25 feet Nylon Cord, Trail Food (optional).

Needed Troop Equipment: 2 dutch ovens, mixing bowls, cutting and cooking utensils, cutting board, spices and seasonings, matches or lighter, display plates or bowls for 3 judges.

Directions to Camp Durant

From Spring Lake go north toward Sanford on NC 24/87

At Spout Springs, exit NC 87 to the right and go west on NC 24 through Cameron and to Carthage. In the event road construction on NC 24/87 has the NC 24 exit closed, continue north to the NC 27 exit. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left and take NC 27 to NC 24. Turn right on NC 24/27

Go through Carthage on NC 24 using the traffic circle around the old county courthouse. About 1.2 miles beyond the old courthouse, turn left on to Bethlehem Church Road. At the intersection of NC 24 and Bethlehem Church Road, there is a sign on the right side of the road showing the turn to “Occonechee Scout Camps”. An old-style gas station sits in the “Y” of the intersection.

Continue on Bethlehem Church Road. After passing the first traffic light, Camp Durant is about 1 mile on the left.

IRON CHEF – DUTCH OVEN COOK-OFF

Rules

Each Troop will send a cook team to the headquarters area and receive a number from the registrar of the Cook-off. The competition will start after the 1:30 assembly. The teams will then pick up all of their ingredients for the Cook-off and wait for instructions. Each team should bring all Troop supplies with them when they check in.

If for some reason a team has forgotten an item/s they will be allowed 1 trip back to their campsite per team to pick up missing item/s. They must first clear this trip with the Cook-off Registrar.

The teams will have 3 hours to prepare, cook and present two dishes, a main meal and a desert, for three judges from the ingredients given them. All food needs to be ready for turn in by 5 PM. If the dishes are not completed on time they will not be scored.

Each cook team will consist of 2 registered boy scouts. NO adults.

Preparing and cooking will take place in front of Headquarters. (if raining, it will be done under shelters.)

Food items when completed will go to the Cook-off registrar when completed.

There will be 3 judges. Each will have a plate of the meal and a plate of desert. Judges will score each item in three different categories. The categories are as follows:

Appearance – 30 pts

Originality – 30 pts

Taste – 40 pts

For a total of 100 pts. If a unit was to get a perfect score it would be 200 pts, 100 for the meal and 100 for desert.
