Cost: \$10.00 per Registered Scout

There will be programs that are optional. Registered Scouts and Adults may participate in them. They will be provided at an additional cost. Scout Units do NOT need to participate in the following programs to win the Kudu Horn. Please find enclosed the registration form for these courses, fill it out and turn it in at registration. If there are slots available, you can sign up once you arrive at camp. These are first come first served courses with priority given to youth so register early.

NRA Pistol Shooting - This is for Adults and Venture Scouts ONLY. There are a limited number of slots for this course. Venture Scouts will have priority and only then will adults fill slots. Once course is complete you will earn the NRA Pistol Patch. Cost is \$20.00 per person. Includes patch, targets and ammunition.

Ham Radio - Scouts will learn the procedures for operating ham radio, once they have completed the course and passed the test, they will receive their license. This class starts Friday evening. Cost is \$12.00 per scout. Includes FCC exam and license.

Emergency Preparedness Elective - This course offers the opportunity to complete certain requirements for the Emergency preparedness program for Venture Scouts. All but a couple of requirements will be completed at camporee. See your unit advisor for more information. Adults may participate in this program as well. Cost is \$20.00 and includes all needed materials to make a First Aid Kit and other materials.

Family Camping: \$3.00 per person for Family camping with a maximum of \$12.00 per family (this doesn't include a patch. You can order patches using the attached form) The fee for Cub Scouts attending the Saturday activities only will be \$10.00.

Register at the January, February, March and April Roundtable using registration forms attached.

Final registration with out penalty will be April 5th, 2010 at McPherson Presbyterian Church.

Late registration fee is \$15.00 per Scout/Scouter effective after April 5, 2010

Camporee Information and Guidelines

1. **Registration:** Your unit is registered when you have paid your fees by using the provided Registration Form or forms in the Leader's Guide. You need to complete a Camporee Unit Roster (also provided), **Registration fees are \$10.00 each per Scout and Scouter. Registration will be at the Round Table in January, February, March, and April, 2010, last day is April 12th, 7 PM at McPherson Presbyterian Church. Fees and registration must be turned in at Roundtable unless other arrangements are made. Contact Camporee Registrar.** Remember to file for a BSA Local Tour Permit, and keep with you a copy of each person's **Health History Form.** .
2. **Late registration fee will be \$15.00 for all registered Scouts at Camporee Headquarters on April 30, 2010. Fees and all registration forms must be completed and presented at the time of registration before your unit will be assigned or allowed to enter a campsite.** All units (Cub or Boy Scout) that have not registered must come to the Dining Hall and complete registration before being assigned a campsite. All registration forms must be completed and turned in by 10:00 PM Friday April 30, 2010.
3. **FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
4. **Campsites:** Will be assigned when you register at Roundtable.
5. **Check-In will begin at 4:00 PM on Friday, April 30, 2010. Absolutely no one will enter earlier!**
 - a. Upon arrival on Friday, registered units will be directed to their campsites. **All drivers must know what unit they belong to!!**
 - b. Unit trailers may be left in camp. **ALL OTHER** vehicles will be out of the campsites and parked in the appropriate parking lots by 11:00 PM. Parking permits for special situations may be obtained from the Camporee chief. Only one permit per unit.
6. **Quiet Hours:** Everyone must be in his or her respective campsites between the hours of **11:00 PM and 6:00 AM.** All are expected to be quiet. "*A Scout is Courteous*". **This is each unit leader's responsibility.**
7. **Health and Safety:** Use the Buddy System! Refer to the "Guide to Safe Scouting" for policies and procedures. All safety precautions will be adhered to throughout the camporee. Report all unsafe conditions and actions to the Camporee Chief immediately. If the action is unsafe, stop the action.
EMERGENCY Protocol: In the event of an emergency, i.e.: lost child or missing person, fire, etc, there will be a series of three (3) blasts of horn. At

that point ALL persons, Scouts and non-Scouts will report to the flag pole at the Headquarters. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS! For everyone's safety, remain at the Commissary (Flag Pole) for further instruction.

8. **First Aid:** Scout leaders are to be prepared to handle all minor situations. Each unit is to have a First Aid Kit in their campsite. Serious injuries and emergencies must be reported immediately to the Camporee Headquarters (Dining Hall). There will be a trained Medical Technician present on site during the entire Camporee. Units having additional trained medical personnel present are asked to notify our Health and Safety Chairperson. The nearest full service hospital is Moore Regional Hospital in Pinehurst, NC.
9. **Campfires:** Fire Pits are prohibited. Use ground fires only (if Camporee staff permits). Under no circumstances will any tree be cut down. Use extreme caution with all fires. Keep all fires at a reasonable size; never leave a fire unattended and always provide adult supervision for all fires. Each unit must bring its own fire extinguishers. **All units need to plan for camp stove cooking or no-heat meals in the event there is a ban on campfires. Use camp stoves properly. This also applies to Cub Scouts and Family Campers. NOTE: Use of liquid fire starters is prohibited within the Boy Scouts of America.**
10. **Chemical Fuels:** Use of liquid fuel, propane, and butane in stoves and lanterns is permitted only with knowledgeable adult supervision.
11. **Campsite Inspection:** Campsites will be inspected. A member from each campsite will assist a campsite inspection team. Each Troop and Pack will be inspected and checked separately. The adult area will not be inspected.
12. **Gateways:** Gateways should mark the entrance way to each campsite. Materials may be preassembled or assembled at site. Units may bring materials with them or find it at Camp Durant. Construction of gateways will be included in Kudu Horn competition. Gateways should reflect the state or area the unit is representing, Packs do not need gateways. Gateways may be pre constructed. Judging will be in two categories, pre made and made on site.
13. **Water:** Water is available at the Campsites. Units will need to provide their own water containers. Scouts should carry their own canteens during all activities. Each unit should bring 50 feet of water hose to help with clean-up.
14. **Uniforms:** Field uniforms are to be worn during Campfire, and the Interfaith Service. Activity uniforms are to be worn at all other times. **Camouflage Clothing is not permitted** at any time for Scouts or Scouters.
15. **Visitors:** Visitors are welcome. They may observe all events, activities, visit unit campsites, and attend the Camporee Campfire. All visitors must leave the Camporee

by 11:00 PM each night. All persons who stay overnight must be registered with a unit or Family Camping and pay appropriate Camporee fees. (All visitors must check in at Camporee Headquarters - Dining Hall)

16. Campfire/Evening Program:

A. There will be a talent show and units are strongly encouraged to participate. We will have the ability to help your unit do Karaoke. The unit must provide the background sound track on disc.

B. The O/A will have a call out campfire at the Campfire Arena.

C. After the O/A Call Out, there will be a movie shown and free pop corn provided. Please bring your camp chair and or blanket and join us at the Grand Lodge.

17. Worship Service: *A Scout is reverent.* An interfaith Scouts Own service will be held on Sunday morning at the Grand Lodge at 8:30 AM. Other services are available, please check the Camporee schedule. There will be no movement of vehicles in camp until after the service is completed. Units will want to print enough copies for their unit of the bulletin for Scouts Own service (enclosed).

18. Check-Out: Check-out forms and procedures will be given upon arrival. **There will be NO CHECKOUTS during camporee activities, i.e., campfire programs or assemblies. Checkout on Sunday will NOT begin until after Scouts Own Service.** Units will receive patches and ribbons upon clearing campsite and turning in evaluations. Units needing to leave on Saturday must check in with registrar before 6 pm Saturday.

19. Trash/Garbage: Expect that all non-burnable garbage and trash will be carried out upon departure. Dumpsters should be available. Insure that all trash is in the dumpster. NOT piled on top or beside it. Please be advised of new North Carolina laws regarding recycling. Be prepared to haul out plastic and aluminum.

20. Alternate Plans: No plans have been made for rescheduling or canceling the camporee. In case of extreme weather or major emergency, the Camporee Chief or the Professional Staff may cancel the camporee. If the camporee is to be cancelled, the Scout shop will be notified. The local radio stations (Q98 & WKML) will also be notified. The County Sheriff or Professional Advisor will notify the Camporee Chief to start evacuation procedures (if needed).

21. Camporee T-shirts must be pre-ordered through Camporee Registrar. Order form is enclosed and required at unit registration. **Deadline for ordering T-Shirts is April Roundtable. NO EXCEPTIONS!**

22. Campsites: Campsites will be assigned to units as they register. Units are expected to share shelters and other facilities and to clean them up together. Troops and Packs with the same chartered organization will camp together. S/M and CM should coordinate before Camporee with set up and joint use plans.

23. PROHIBITED ITEMS: Refer to the “Guide to Safe Scouting.” Insure all adults are aware of the policies and procedures of this guide as “I didn’t know,” is no excuse. Additionally, youth are **NOT** to carry communication or radio devices. Frequencies will be assigned at check in for units requiring radio communication for adult leaders. Anyone bringing or carrying prohibited items will be required to leave with forfeiture of all fees paid. Sheath knives are not allowed at Camporee.

24. Absolutely no pets are allowed. This includes visitors. Disability Service Dogs are permitted.

25. RULES VIOLATIONS: The Camporee Chief in consultation with the Camporee Staff will determine penalties for any violation of the rules.

26. Lost and Found: Lost and Found items are to be turned in to Headquarters (Dining Hall). These items will be displayed at Flag Raising/Flag Lowering and Assembly.

27. Needed Equipment: Each **TROOP** should bring:

1. 50 feet of garden hose. This will make cleaning bathrooms much easier.
2. Necessary cleaning supplies
3. Equipment listed for Iron Chef Cook-off -- See insert for list
4. Rope for Gateway construction

CAMPOREE GAMES AND SATURDAY NIGHT MEAL

Each Troop will select a Region and a state in that Region from across America. Research Scouting in that area and select a game and a meal that best describes your selections. Selections are a first come first serve basis. Your gateway should represent your selected region and state.

At the Camporee your troop is to set –up and run your game as a camporee event. Your troop will score the event based on a timed event or high score event. Your troop can not participate in the event only run the event. Your event should clearly represent the region and state selected. A adult from each unit are more will run the event, {asst scoutmaster, committee member, parent}.

Competitions and Other Fun Things To Do Something for Everyone (Adults and Youth)

Oldest T-Shirt Competition: T-shirt must be an older scouting t-shirt. Can be from any Scout event such as Summer Camp, Camporee, Jamboree or a Cub Scout Day Camp. Must have the year printed on shirt. Can be from another council. Very Important, IT MUST BE WORN to the noon assembly. Adults and Youth can participate.

Adult Leader Cook-Off: This competition is for adults only. Prizes will be awarded for best in each category. Judges will be the same as Iron Chef. Show off your outdoor culinary skills. Rules and other information are printed in this guide with the Iron Chef Competition.

Stave Competition: Bring your stave or walking stick to the Dining Hall during the day on Saturday. It will be judged at 5:30. Staves can be handmade or store purchased, but personalized. Creativity counts. See attached Stave information.

Dunking Booth: We have three very special guests you will want to get wet. Come and try your best. Will cost \$1:00 for two balls. A unit can purchase unlimited balls for \$25.00 for 15 minutes and toss them at an adult member of your unit. All of the proceeds go to Friends of Scouting (FOS).

Iron Chef Contest Rules

The Iron Chef competition will be similar to the one on the Food Network show, with a twist. Our Iron Chef will be done with Dutch Ovens only.

Each Troop will have a Team of 2 Scouts (**no Adults allowed**). You will be given 3 hours to complete 2 dishes; a main dish and a dessert. Both dishes will incorporate the “secret ingredient”. Each Team will be allowed to bring:

- 1 3 vegetables
- 2 1 meat
- 3 1 fruit
- 4 1 garnish (to be used during plating only. It may not be incorporated into the dish.)
- 5 Seasonings and spices (If you bring a fruit or vegetable as a seasoning, it will be counted as a fruit or vegetable.) **No pre-prepared sauces or dressings are allowed!**
- 6 Flours
- 7 Sugars
- 8 Vegetable oil

All teams are to assemble in front of the old dining hall at 1:30 pm for instructions. All cooking equipment and food must be with you at that time. You will register your team **and your ingredients** before the “secret ingredient” will be handed out. Please, follow the approved list of ingredients. Iron chef registrar and judges have the right to disallow the use of an ingredient if it doesn't meet the approved list. Cooking will take place in the designated area. Competition will start at 2 pm and finish at 5 pm. You will plate your food and get it to the judging area by 5:00pm. The following items will be provided to each team:

- 1 Water
- 2 Serving dishes
- 3 Charcoal and newspaper (The Scouts will be expected to start their own charcoal using a chimney.)
- 4 Metal charcoal pans. However, if you have a Dutch Oven table and would like to use it for your cooking, that would be acceptable.

There will be a panel of 3 judges. Each judge can award up to 20 points per entry. Every team could get as much as 60 points for this event. The team of Scouts from each unit will be expected to tell the judges how they incorporated the secret ingredient into both of their dishes.

10 points for best use of “secret ingredient”

5 points for presentation

5 points for taste

There are a few things that we don't want to see.

- 1 Any kitchen tools that you would not normally use at a regular campout.
- 2 Cookbooks
- 3 Drinks with the dishes
