Program Happenings:

**Scouting for Food:** We in the Kia Kima District need to do something to help Cumberland County and the State of North Carolina with the hunger problem. R. Glenn Stevens Scouter of the Year Award:

R. Glenn Stevens (everyone called him Glenn) served Kia Kima District for many years as District Chairman, Program Chairman, Commissioner, Membership Chairman, Friends of Scouting Coordinator, Scoutmaster, Cubmaster and Charter Organization Representative are some of the positions he served in. Before Kia Kima was a District Glenn served in the Rainey District, for a total in scouting of over 30 years as an adult. He served on the Council board, worked on Scout-O-Rama, District and Council Camporees.

He received the Scouters Key as a Cubmaster, Scoutmaster and Commissioner. The Scouters award, District Award of Merit (twice) and the Silver Beaver. He was also Scouter of the Year (three times). Glenn was a Scouters Scouter. His joy came from working directly with the boys, which he did until his death.

The R. Glenn Stevens Scouter of the Year Award is for someone who has gone above and beyond the regular course of their duties for the job they hold. Serving not only the unit they are with but also the District and community. He served not only Peace Presbyterian Church but helped to hold services at Highland House every Sunday. His widow Mildred has been able to attend a few of the recognitions dinners over the years since he passed away and presented the award to the recipient.

Glenn was for over 20 years Santa Claus in the Fayetteville Christmas parade. He made many children happy by visiting their homes, schools and Pack Christmas parties as the jolly old man himself.
